## A Quiet Day

### *Creative Spaces: Insights from Matthew's portrayal of Jesus*

“She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins” (Mtt 1:21) Matthew's gospel, written to affirm the church's message and mission, naturally focuses on the person of Jesus - who he was; why he came; what he did. Following the genealogy in the opening verses of chapter 1 the name 'Jesus' is introduced - a name which can be translated as 'spaciousness' or 'the one who gives us room'. Through a series of short reflections and periods of silence we will draw on examples from Matthew's portrayal of Jesus as the one who opens up for us creative spaces in which we can grow and flourish.

## The Venue


