

ST PAUL'S CHURCH OF ENGLAND VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED PRIMARY SCHOOL – INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

1. The name of the school is St Paul's Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School.
2. The school is a voluntary controlled school.
3. The name of the governing body is The Governing Body of St Paul's Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School.
4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. two parent governors;
 - b. one LA governor;
 - c. one staff governor;
 - d. one head teacher;
 - e. two foundation governors;
 - f. seven co-opted governors.
5. Total number of governors: fourteen
6. Appointed foundation governors are to be appointed by the York Diocesan Board of Education after consultation with the Parochial Church Council of the Parish Church of Saint Paul, York.
7. (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex officio:
The Principal Officiating Minister in the Parish of Saint Paul, York.
- (b) The Archdeacon of York shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that ex officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21(1) of the Regulations.
8. The Archdeacon of York is entitled to request the removal of any ex-officio foundation governor and to appoint any substitute governor.
9. There is a trust for the school, supported by a Trust Deed dated 9th December 1887.
10. The ethos for the school is as follows:

Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.
11. This instrument of government comes into effect on June 24th 2015.

12. This instrument was made by order of the City of York Local Education Authority on
23rd April 2015.
13. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governor body (and the headteacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
