


Michael Stallybrass

General Synod (House of Laity) Candidate 2015

I am writing to seek your support for election to General Synod in the forthcoming elections. I am on the electoral Roll of St Mary's Priory church, Old Malton, am licenced as a Lay Reader to the Benefice of Malton and Old Malton in Southern Ryedale, and have been nominated by David Millican, South Wold Deanery, and seconded by John Rummel, Southern Ryedale Deanery. As a lay person, I have been Lay Chair of Southern Ryedale Deanery for three years, am a member of Diocesan Synod, and also a member of the Diocesan Deaneries Working Group.



I was baptized and confirmed as an adult, and have been a Lay Reader for the past thirty five years, offering ministry as a Reader in three different Dioceses, Derby, Worcester, and York. I am currently undertaking training to work in and support the development of a local ecumenical Chaplaincy team. I am married to a Catholic, have four grown-up daughters, and this year we celebrated our fortieth wedding anniversary. Now semi-retired, but running a small specialist international consultancy business, my career in the Railway Industry has taken me all around the world. I am also half Norwegian, and regularly spend time in Norway. It has been a privilege over the years to have been a member of Anglican, Catholic, Lutheran, Southern Baptist and Pentecostal congregations in various continents as a result.

I bring a passionate interest in Ecumenism, Lay Ministry, the Rural Church, and the liturgical use of music. the global Body of Christ, in the face of the many challenges that we all face now and will face in the future.
