

INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

- 1. The name of the federation is The Beeford and North Frodingham Federation.
- 2. The schools in the federation are:

- 3. The name of the governing body of the federation is "The Governing Body of The Beeford and North Frodingham Federation."
- 4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - 1 Executive Headteacher;
 - 1 Local Authority governor;
 - 1 Staff governor;
 - 2 Parent governors;
 - 2 Foundation governors;
 - 8 Co-opted governors.
- 5. The total number of governors is 15.
- 6. Foundation Governors are appointed by the York Diocesan Board of Education, after consultation with the Parochial Church Council of Beeford.
- 7. (a) The holder of the following offices shall be foundation governors ex officio:

The Principal Officiating Minister of the Parish of Beeford.

(b) The Archdeacon of the East Riding shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in place of an ex officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from an office named in (a) above, in the event that the relevant ex officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or where there is a vacancy by virtue of which his or her governorship exists.

The Archdeacon of the East Riding is entitled to request the removal of any ex officio foundation governor and to appoint a substitute governor.

- 8. Beeford Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School has a Trust Deed dated 26 November 1880.
- 9. The ethos of Beeford CE VC Primary School is as follows:

"Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers all its pupils."

- 10. This Instrument comes into effect on 8 September 2016.
- 11. This Instrument was made by order of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council on 27 May 2016.
- 12. A copy of the Instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the headteacher if not a governor), any trustee and to the appropriate religious body.
