INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT (VARIATION) ORDER NO. 4 (2017)

Made 1 June 2017

Coming into force 26 June 2017

In exercise of the powers conferred by Paragraph 30 of the School Governance (Constitution) (England) Regulations 2012 Statutory Instrument 2012/1034, and after carrying out such consultations as are required to be carried out, East Riding of Yorkshire Council being the local education authority for the County of East Yorkshire hereby make the following order:-

1. This Order may be cited as Warter CE Primary School Instrument of Government (Variation) Order No 4 (2017) and shall come into force on 26 June 2017.

2. In paragraph 4,

"The governing body shall consist of:

1 Headteacher governor;

1 Local Authority governor;

1 Staff governor;

3 Parent governors;

2 Foundation governors;

4 Co-opted governors.

shall be replaced by:

"The governing body shall consist of:

1 Headteacher governor;

1 Local Authority governor;

1 Staff governor;

2 Parent governors;

2 Foundation governors;

5 Co-opted governors.

3. The total number of governors is 12.

4. Variation Order No. 4 (2017) was approved by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council on 1 June 2017.



INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

1. The name of the school is Warter Church of England Primary School
 2. The school is a foundation school.
 3. The name of the governing body is The Governing Body of Warter Church of England Primary School
 4. The governing body shall consist of:
 - 1 Headteacher governor;
 - 1 Local Authority governor;
 - 1 Staff governor;
 - 3 Parent governors;
 - 2 Foundation governors;
 - 4 Co-opted governors.
 5. The total number of governors is 12.
 6. Appointed foundation governors are appointed by the York Diocesan Board of Education after consultation with the Parochial Church Council of the Parish in which the school is situated.
 7. (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex-officio:

The Principal Officiating Minister of the Parish in which the school is situated.

(b) The Archdeacon of York shall appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex-officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that the ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or where there is a vacancy in the office by virtue of which his or her governorship exists.
- The Archdeacon of York is entitled to request the removal of any ex-officio foundation governor and to appoint any substitute governor.

8. The ethos of the school is as follows:

“Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils”.

10. This Instrument of Government comes into effect: 3rd March, 2015.
11. This Instrument was made by order of the East Riding of Yorkshire Local Education Authority on 16th January, 2015.
12. A copy of the Instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the headteacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
