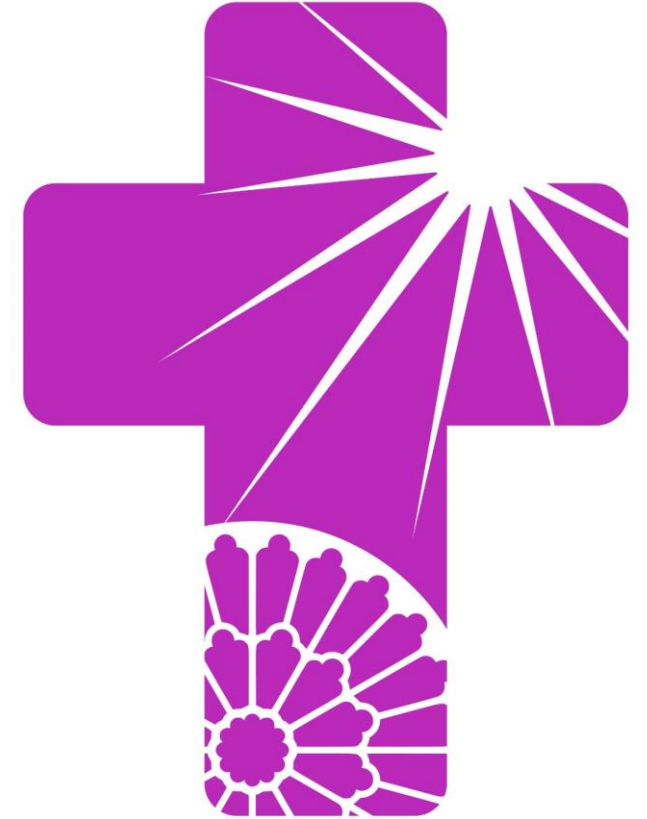
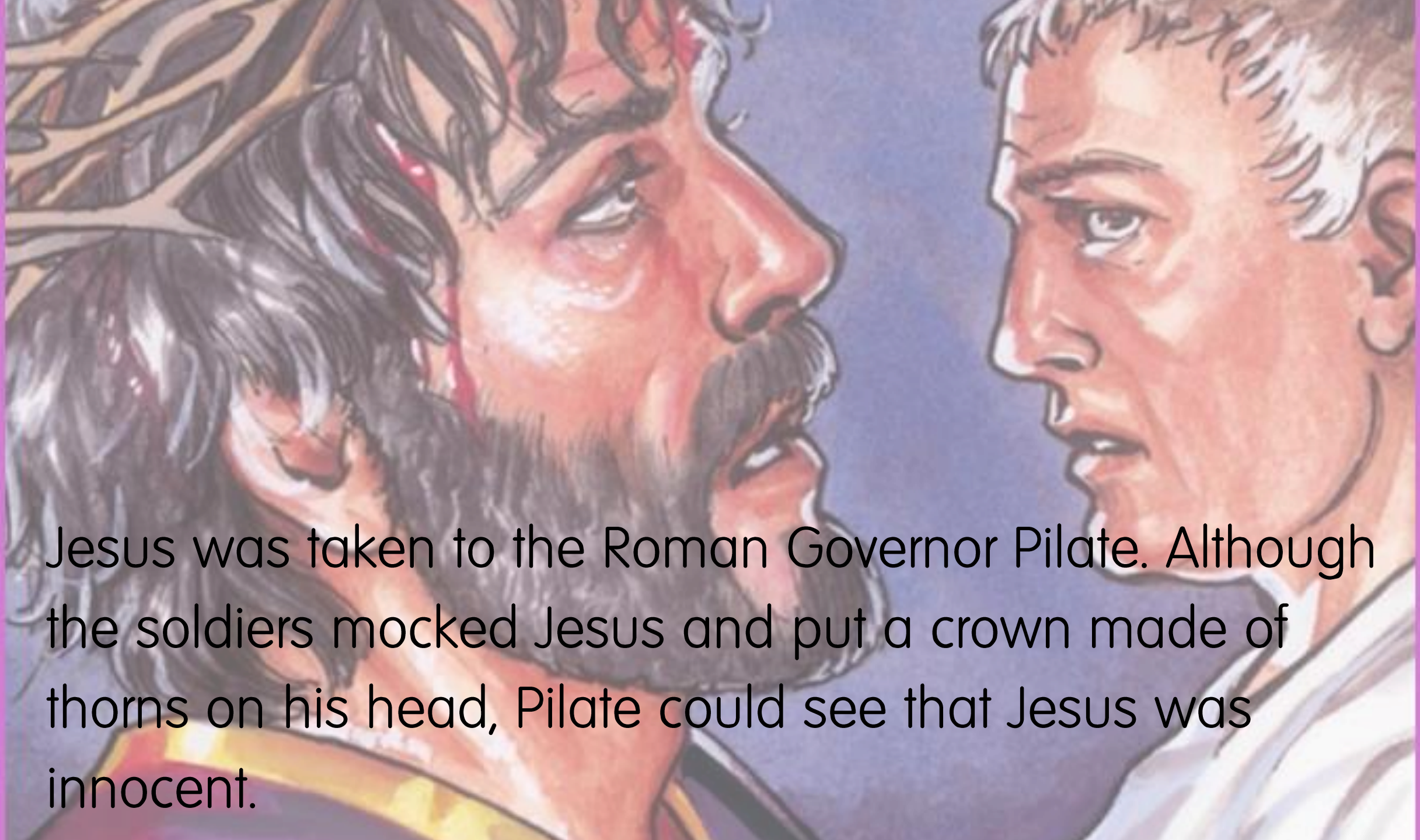




**Jesus is put on trial**







