

COURSE INFORMATION

The Foundations in Ministry course is for anyone exploring their call to ministry or simply wanting to get more involved in their local churches. Running over a year, you will become part of an accompanied learning community supporting you in developing your ministry in your local context or church setting.

This learning community is the first step for those who are interested in developing their ministry and would like to explore their calling to either authorised or licensed ministry.

At the end of the course and on completion of your safeguarding training you will be eligible to become an Authorised Lay Minister (ALM). For those who feel a call to licensed ministry there will be additional support preparing for the relevant discernment process.

What can I expect?

The course runs for 10 months and includes a mix of local gathered days and online sessions. See the course dates in this leaflet. You can expect an informal and relaxed learning environment that aims to build up the confidence of all participants and affirm them in their ministry development.

Are there written assignments?

There are no formal academic assignments on this course as it is not accredited through an academic partner. There will be a variety of preparatory tasks which will help you to reflect on your own ministry and self development as well as tasks that you will be able to work through with your local mentor.

Cost

There is no cost for the course, however we hope that your PCC will support you in your formation journey. This may include:

- Providing an appropriate mentor see the Guidance for Mentors section
- Funding your travel to the gathered sessions
- Providing you with a budget for your practical tasks
- Providing you with access to IT and internet.


The gathered days are designed to equip you with the tools you need in your ministry. There will be input from experienced tutors, practical group work, community worship and space for fellowship.

These days are based in different locations for different cohorts across the Diocese to ensure that we are offering local and accessible training.



Your mentor will be someone who has ministry experience and ideally understands your own church context. They will walk alongside you and be a key part of your formation.

We can help you to identify a suitable mentor. Mentors will be resourced and equipped to support you in a meaningful and helpful way. Please see the section about/for mentors later in this Course Guide for more details.



Online Sessions

The online sessions are designed to provide the opportunity to engage with relevant topics whilst gathering the whole cohort together to reflect on your practical experience so far and to learn from each other.

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


PLEASE NOTE: These dates and topics may be subject to change - we hope to have confirmation for all very soon.

Guidance for Mentors

Mentoring is all about building a trusting relationship which will enhance learning on the course. As a mentor you will walk alongside your mentee in their church context and be a key part of their formation as they reflect on what they are learning and explore what God is calling them to. It is an intentional, prayerful, and supportive relationship with regular contact for the duration of the course.



God is at work, and the mentor is there to help the person on the course to see what God is doing in their life and encourage them to step into that in practical ways.

Core tasks for the Mentor:

- Praying for the person you are mentoring.
- Connecting well with the person, building an open and trusting relationship.
- Developing the mentoring relationship by meeting regularly.
- Evaluating with the person you are mentoring and adjusting support as you go.
- Providing feedback on their development during the course.

Key results - what we are expecting:

- The person you are mentoring grows in their faith, becoming more Christlike.
- They apply what they have been learning and grow in skills and experience.
- Their confidence increases.

Mentoring process with expected time commitment:

- Attending resourcing and training at the start of the course (c.2 hours).
- Meeting regularly with your mentee. This will be by negotiation and agreement with them, but we would hope this would take place as a minimum once per half term (6 times across the 10 months).
- Observing your mentee in their ministry context ideally once per half term in order for you to have a conversation with them on their progress and growth in confidence and competence.
- Access to the online Diocese of York Learning Hub where you will be able to review the group's previous learning before you meet with your mentee.
- A review meeting at the end of the course with the Start of Lay Ministry Advisor and your mentee to reflect together on how they have developed over the duration of the course.
- We would love it if all mentors can attend the Celebration of Lay Ministries Service which will take place in the September after completion of the course.
