Theme: Questions

Equipment: pieces of card-

**Set Up:** you could use some green fabric and create a 'gardeny' area for the activity. Hang the strings and put the pegs nearby.

## The Garden of Gethsemane

After they had eaten their Passover meal Jesus and his friends went out to the Garden of Gethsemane. He was sad when his friends fell asleep instead of

praying with him. Jesus talked to God about what was going to happen.

He knew it would be terrible and thought about avoiding it, but

decided that he was to be obedient

as it was God's plan to save everyone. His friend Judas arrived with armed men to arrest him. Jesus had been betrayed and was taken to the house of Caiaphas, the High Priest.





Theme: Help

Equipment: small pot of soil, plant markers or lolly sticks

**Set Up:** you could use a larger tray of soil with pupils given individual markers or sticks

All of us need help sometimes. Just before he was arrested, when Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane, he asked God to help him. What do you need help with?
